

## Set up other mobile devices

You can access your Google Apps email and calendar on a wide variety of devices using the phone's mobile browser. The mobile browser offers familiar features like Gmail archiving and labels, it's always in sync with Gmail's main server, and there's no setup required.

### Using a mobile browser

- For email, go to <http://mail.google.com/a/mexico.k12.mo.us> on your device's browser.
- For calendar, go to <http://mail.google.com/a/mexico.k12.mo.us> on your device's browser.

## Configuring other mail clients

### The Quick Answer

- Follow the instructions below to set up IMAP<sup>1</sup> access in most email clients.
- [Google Apps](#) users, please follow the default instructions unless otherwise noted, replacing 'your\_domain.com' with your actual domain<sup>2</sup> name.

You can use the following information to configure IMAP with many mail clients. If you encounter difficulties, we suggest contacting your mail client's customer support department for further instructions -- we're unable to provide assistance with configuring mail clients not listed [here](#).

<b>Incoming Mail (IMAP) Server - requires SSL:</b>	imap.gmail.com <b>Use SSL:</b> Yes <b>Port:</b> 993
<b>Outgoing Mail (SMTP) Server - requires TLS:</b>	smtp.gmail.com (use authentication) <b>Use Authentication:</b> Yes <b>Use STARTTLS:</b> Yes (some clients call this SSL) <b>Port:</b> 465 or 587
<b>Account Name:</b>	your full email address (including @gmail.com) Google Apps users, please enter username@your_domain.com
<b>Email Address:</b>	your full Gmail email address (username@gmail.com) Google Apps users, please enter username@your_domain.com
<b>Password:</b>	your Gmail password

Please note that if your client does not support SMTP<sup>3</sup> authentication, you won't be able to send mail through your client using your Gmail address.

Also, if you're having trouble sending mail but you've confirmed that encryption is active for SMTP in your mail client, try to configure your SMTP server on a different port: 465 or 587.

1. **IMAP:** IMAP (Internet message access protocol) lets you download messages from Gmail so you can access your mail with a program like Outlook Express or Apple Mail. IMAP syncs the actions you take in Outlook Express or Apple Mail with Gmail so if you read a message in your mail client, it'll be marked as read in Gmail.
2. **domain:** A domain is a name for an IP address and is more commonly recognized as a website or web address. For example, Google.com is a domain.
3. **SMTP:** SMTP (Simple Mail Transfer Protocol) is a set of standard Internet procedures by which two email providers (ex. Gmail, Yahoo Mail), transfer email messages to one another's mail servers.
